Performance Management for Immediately Reportable and 24 Hour Reportable Communicable Disease:

- Immediately reportable diseases are responded to and investigated immediately 100% of the time.
- 24 hour reportable diseases are responded to and investigated on the same day, or on the next day 100% of the time.

***Included in this report are MCRHC towns and Middletown.**

***Since May of 2021, Confirmed cases of Novel Coronavirus 2019 (SARS CoV2) have decreased by about 43%. Total cases reported of Novel Coronavirus 2019 have decreased by about 41.7%. Of the COVID-19 test results reported for the MCRHC jurisdictions (including Middletown), 95.5% are Confirmed positive.**

***Currently, more individuals are vaccinated than before, in Monmouth County and in NJ. This could account for the great decrease in COVID-19 Confirmed cases for June 2021. The cases, however, seem to be decreasing at a slower rate for June of 2021.**

***MCRHC has seen a slight increase in non-COVID communicable disease cases for June of 2021, in all categories but for Tick-borne and GI illness in particular.**
